

Please step up to help your Chapter. The deadline is June 30th, 2024.

*These positions need to be filled to remain a Chapter.



The election of officers is in the near future. Everyone needs to be aware of what will happen if our club does not have people who are willing to step up and take over the responsibilities of our club's offices.

I am going to outline the duties of each office today but before that, I am here to let you know what will happen if we do not jump in and volunteer for these offices.

ALL CHAPTERS must maintain a minimum number of memberships in order to retain their accredited status. WE HAVE DONE THIS.

Just for your information, a chapter must maintain a minimum of 15 FMCA memberships. An Associate Chapter must maintain seven FMCA memberships.

In not, the chapter shall revert to an inactive chapter status. At this time, the National or Alternate National Director shall have no input in the proceedings of the Government board.

Chapters remaining inactive longer than two years shall no longer be considered an active chapter of FMCA and shall be dissolved.

NOW TO THE IMMEDIATE NEED OF OUR CLUB

A Chapter (Club) must have the following offices who may serve a one or two-year term (Total four years).

President

One or more Vice Presidents

Secretary

Treasurer

National Director and may have an Alternate National Director.

At present, a Chapter may combine the Secretary and Treasurer,

A chapter other than associate, must maintain at least three (3) members holding the officer positions in that chapter. An FMCA member may hold no more than two-chapter offices simultaneously. A member may hold an office in two chapters.

Presidents Responsibilities:

- 1. A Chapter Officers Handbook is provided to each chapter.
- 2. Chapter meetings should be conducted in an orderly manner and be in accordance with the FMCA Constitution, FMCA Bylaws, FMCA Policies and Procedures, and Member Code of Ethics.
- 3. The chapter president is responsible for seeing that all of the duties and responsibilities of all



of the other chapter officers are performed in a timely manner in accordance with FMCA's requirements.

- 4. The chapter president receives all Governing Board mailings to help keep the chapter informed on national FMCA activities.
- 5. The chapter president should see that all needed committees are duly elected or appointed.

Vice Presidents Responsibilities

The Chapter Vice President assists the President in his or her duties. If a vacancy occurs in the office of the President, the Vice President shall perform in accordance with FMCA Policies and Procedure #3018, Chapter President's Responsibilities.

Secretary's Responsibilities

- 1. For certification purposes, no later than December 31st of each year, the Secretary for each chapter and associate chapter shall furnish to the National Office of FMCA a list of its membership, a list of incumbent chapter officers, and certify that the chapter held the required meeting in the chapter's previous fiscal period. Additionally, the Secretary shall indicate whether the chapter will change its status:
- 2. Within thirty days of election, each Chapter Secretary shall furnish the National Office of FMCA a list of newly elected officers or change in status of chapter officers. This report shall include the addresses and telephone numbers of each person so elected.
- 3. Prior to each Governing Board meeting, the Chapter Secretary shall complete and return the Governing Board roll call sheet verifying the National Director, Alternate National Director, or Temporary Delegate for the chapter. (NOTE: Not applicable to associate chapters)
- 4. The Chapter Secretary may complete the Rally Calendar submission form if the chapter wants its rallies listed in the FMCA Events section of the appropriate issue of Family RVing magazine.
- 5. The Chapter Secretary is expected to keep a formal record -- usually called minutes -- of the proceedings of all meetings of the chapter's membership. This record shall be read and approved at the next meeting, unless said reading is waived by majority vote. A formal record of all meetings is to be made available in the event a member of the chapter desires to read them.

Within 30 days of election, each chapter secretary shall furnish the national office of FMCA with a list of newly elected officers.

For certification purposes, each chapter secretary shall furnish to the national office of FMCA the required records for certification as cited in the FMCA Policies and Procedures.

Treasurers Responsibilities

- 1. The chapter treasurer keeps accurate accounts of all chapter funds and renders reports on same at each business meeting of the chapter's membership.
- 2. The chapter treasurer disburses chapter funds only for authorized chapter purposes, and only in accordance with the chapter bylaws and/or standing rules.
- 3. The chapter treasurer is responsible for obtaining and maintaining the chapter EIN (Employer Identification Number).
- 4. The chapter treasurer is responsible for filing an electronic IRS form 990-N e-Postcard, which is required for all chapters with gross receipts under \$50,000. Chapters/Areas with more than \$50,000 in gross receipts should consult their tax advisor regarding their filing obligation.



5. The chapter treasurer should ensure that an annual audit of the chapter's financial books and records shall be undertaken and reported to the membership.

National Directors Responsibilities


- 1. Each chapter shall elect a member as National Director to serve on the Governing Board of FMCA and may elect a member as Alternate National Director to serve on the Governing Board if the national director is unable or unwilling to serve.
- 2. The term of office of a newly elected national director or alternate national director begins after the national office receives written notice of said election and has verified that the person is qualified. The term extends for the period specified in the chapter bylaws, or until his or her successor is duly elected and qualified.
- 3. If a vacancy occurs in the office of the National director, the Alternate National Director, if one has been elected, shall immediately assume this office, and this shall be promptly reported in writing to the national office. If the incumbent alternate national director is unable to fill this vacancy, the chapter is to promptly elect (not appoint) a member to fill the vacancy in the office of national director and notify the national office.
- 4. If the National Director cannot attend the Governing Board meeting, the Alternate National Director may serve in his/her place. In the event that neither the National Director nor the Alternate National Director can attend, a member of that chapter may be elected as a temporary delegate to represent the chapter for the next Governing Board meeting only.

If an event occurs after the 21-day notice requirement has passed that prevents the National Director, Alternate National Director, or temporary delegate from attending the Governing Board meeting, the chapter president may appoint a member of the chapter as a temporary delegate to represent the chapter for the next Governing Board meeting only. Notice of the chapter president's appointment of a temporary delegate shall be received by FMCA at least seven working days prior to the Governing Board meeting to be valid. Notice must be in writing (fax or e-mail acceptable).

5. A chapter voting member of the Governing Board is entitled to represent only one chapter.

I do hope this information helped you to see we need volunteers badly to fill the officers' positions.

Summer is almost here as we prepare for FMCA's 109th International Convention and RV Expo, "Adventure Peaks", and presented By Beaver Coach Sales. The convention is scheduled for August 14 through 17, 2024, at the Deschutes County Fair & Expo Center in Redmond, Oregon. To register, use the form included by visiting www.fmca.com/fmca-redmond-2024-learn-more, or call our Events Department at (800) 543-3622.

The annual FMCA Governing Board meeting will take place on August 14 in Redmond. The Governing Board meeting material is expected to be mailed in early to mid-July. Chapter Secretaries received a roll call sheet for this meeting requesting verification of their chapter voting representatives. National Directors will be mailed a copy of the Governing Board booklet. Please bring it with you to the meeting.

If you are a voting delegate for this meeting and will be traveling during this time frame, please notify the national office that you will not be at your address of record to receive this packet, so other arrangements can be made. If you are not a delegate for this meeting but you are a Chapter Alternate National Director or Chapter President and would like a meeting booklet mailed to you, please contact the Chapter Services Department at the national office. The FMCAssist Medical Emergency and Travel Assistance Program is one of the more popular benefits FMCA offers. The policy allows members to enjoy peace of mind while traveling. The best



part of the benefit is that it is included with membership dues. Because of the popularity of the benefit, utilization has been high over the last two years, which has driven up the premium. The policy is due to be renewed on October 1, 2024. FMCA has been given a quote that is nearly double the current premium, which equates to an increase of around \$400,000. The current dues level does not support this massive increase. During the meeting in Redmond, the Governing Board will have to decide whether to raise dues to keep the benefit, or to not include it in dues and instead offer a discounted policy for members to purchase. This will be a big decision for the association.

Credit cards give members a convenient payment option. Due to rising popularity, this has become the preferred method of payment. ACH (Automated Clearing House) payments will be added very soon as well. With 66,000 member families, FMCA processes a high volume of credit card transactions, which results in an annual expense of \$250,000.

This is something that FMCA will not be able to continue to absorb. The Executive Board voted recently to implement a 3.5% convenience fee on all credit card and ACH transactions. If members pay by check or cash, the fee will not be incurred. This change will go into effect soon.

FMCA is once again offering hands-on RV Driving and RV Backing classes in conjunction with the RV Driving School, August 7-12, 2024, just prior to the Redmond convention. If you are interested in participating in either or both classes, please contact the Events Department.

There are still spaces left for the Chapter Fair in Redmond, Oregon. The deadline to register your chapter and sign up for a table is July 15, 2024. Contact the Chapter Services team to reserve your spot: (513) 474-3622, or (800) 543-3622; or email chapters@fmca.com. Because tables and chairs must be ordered in advance, we cannot take on-site registrations. Tables are limited. Please register now. The Chapter Fair will take place on Tuesday, August 13. See the enclosed flier. There will also be a "Mountain Magic" Parade leading to the "Evening Summit". Chapterfest on Friday, August 16, 2024. Now's your chance to put together a basket for the Driven To Care Silent Auction in Redmond. Money collected for the auction items will be donated to Hospice of Redmond - Camp Sunrise, a grief camp for kids and teens. Basket examples could be a specific food unique to your chapter's scope, such as Cincinnati-style chili; a spa package; handcrafted items, etc. Additional information to follow.

The results of the biannual elections conducted for the Area Vice President position in the Eastern, Great Lakes, International, Northwest, and Western areas are included in this mailing. These officers will serve on the Executive Board for a two-year term and take office during the Annual Membership Meeting in Redmond, Oregon, on August 17.



What Is It Illegal For The U.S. Treasury To Print On Currency?

Although it might simply appear to be a matter of national pride and design aesthetic that all U.S. currency with a person depicted on it carries the portrait of a long-deceased but historically significant American, it's both national pride and a matter of law. Under the laws governing the production and printing of U.S. securities (which includes currency), it is illegal to feature portraiture of a living person on securities. As such, the U.S. Treasury maintains a policy of selecting significant figures from American history that are well known to the public. The current set of portraits were originally chosen in 1928 and have been updated several times when new security features and layouts were introduced.

While that's an interesting tidbit, what makes for an even more interesting story is how the decision to ban living people from being featured on currency was arrived at. The law dates back to 1866 and came about because Spencer M. Clark, then the Superintendent of the National Currency Bureau, issued a 5-cent paper note that featured his face. Not only was this universally considered in poor taste, but Clark was not particularly well liked in the government because of various scandals that he'd been involved in. Shortly after the release of the scandalous 5-cent note, the next appropriations bill was amended to include a prohibition against putting the face of a living person on any currency.
